# **Employment Programs for Refugee Youth**



# A PRACTICAL FRAMEWORK

## Why is it important to provide employment programs for refugee youth?

Employment programs empower refugee youth, help them to develop important skills, and strengthen the local economy.

#### Refugees are young and can offset the effects of an aging workforce:

According to the 2021 Census, only 19% of the population in Nova Scotia were under the age of 20 (Census of Population). For refugees admitted to Nova Scotia between 2015 and 2025, however, nearly half (44%) were under the age of 18 (Open Government).

Refugees are likely to stay in the region: For refugees admitted to Nova Scotia in 2016, most (86%) continued to live in the province after five years, compared to only 51% of economic immigrants (Longitudinal Immigration Database; Statistics Canada).

Workforce inclusion is a pathway to more inclusive communities and improved immigrant retention. Providing a robust system of employment support for all residents of Nova Scotia, and especially for underrepresented and equity-deserving groups, is key to unlocking economic and social prosperity in the province and beyond.
